A Note from Our Pastor



The Old One Has Gone, and the New Is Here

I hope you enjoy this beautiful Spring season with the Risen Lord. As I remember, this year's Lenten season, Holy Week, and Easter were very busy, meaningful, and productive. On Easter Sunday (4/20), 144 people attended and celebrated Jesus' Resurrection. I am so glad to officiate infant baptisms for two little ones. I believe that this Easter should be valued not only to celebrate the Risen Lord but also to celebrate picking up St. John's average worship attendance before the Pandemic.

When I began my ministry at St. John's in 2018, St. John's weekly average attendance was 115. This number lasted consistently before the Pandemic. Indeed, to count the average worship attendance was meaningless during the Pandemic and is even post-pandemic. Still, many churches are struggling with lots of issues, among them, picking up worship attendance has been challenging.

Some of you may have reservations because there were families for the Baptism. Of course I agree. Reflecting all those numbers from the Baptism family, I believe St. John's picked up '115' successfully. Plus, all the beautiful music, Children's fantastic music performance, Bells and Choirs, and singing hymns without masks... all these things were the special gifts from God this Easter.

The Living Last Supper on Maundy Thursday (4/17) should be mentioned highly. To be honest, recruiting a minimum of 13 people for this event is not easy. Do you know this? It is like a local church's worship attendance every Sunday! With that, all those who made the Living Last Supper this year should be highly praised.

No matter how, St. John's is experiencing a big transition. Please look at the pictures. On April 4 (Friday), St. John's old kitchen stove was removed. It took roughly two hours as the stove was so big and heavy. On the same day, in my home country (South Korea), their Supreme Court ordered the impeached president to be removed from office. Stay tuned! More good things will come soon!
